Terry Fox ran with a prosthetic leg across Canada. The prosthetic leg carried his weight. His grit and determination carried the burden of a world not clued-on to the scourge of cancer. He ran for 143 days and 5,373 kilometres. Terry passed away on June 28, 1981 at the age 22 but not before igniting the imagination of the world to focus on cancer research. A Terry Fox Run is organised in several countries as an annual event to raise funds for Cancer Research. As of now, over \$ 600 million has been collected

Akash Dube was all of 17 years when he was diagnosed of Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. Inspired by Terry he partnered with the Rotary Club of Madras East and IIT Madras and helped start the Chennai leg of the Terry Fox Run in 2009. Akash passed away after a fitting fight against cancer on the 11th of May 2012.
